

The Barnes County Commission met in regular session on Tuesday, November 19, 2024, with Bill Carlbom, Cindy Schwehr, Vicky Lovell, Pete Paulson, and Shawn Olauson present. Chairman Bill Carlbom called the meeting to order at 8:15 a.m., roll call was taken, the Pledge of Allegiance was recited, and the agenda was reviewed.

Cindy Schwehr was presented with a clock and cake as a thank you for 24 years of service as a Barnes County Commissioner. Cindy is stepping down as county commissioner and this is her last meeting as a county commissioner. Thank you, Cindy, for your dedication and caring for the county during all these years.

#### **Department Head Meeting**

Emergency Manager, Jessica Jenrich, is working with City County Health District to set up Emergency Shelters. County Extension Agent, Alisha Harstad, is working on the crop show for the next Winter Show, Ag Day in December, 4-H just had their award banquet. 911 Dispatch Coordinator, Sarah Miller, is working on radio's for SIRN, there will be a county wide responder meeting, the State would like to put up another tower, employees are using vacation, so they don't lose it. Highway Superintendent, Jamie Smith, has the highway crew wrapping up projects, planning for next year's projects and they are ready for winter. Park Manager, Scott Kohler, reports the parks are closed for the season and thank you to the Highway Department crew for fixing the road at Little Yellowstone. Treasurer, Debbie Magnuson, has sent out courtesy notices and tax reminders for three-year delinquent taxes. Veteran Service Officer, Tammy Jacobson, is working on getting another van driver and the Camp Grafton deer hunt. Tax Director, Stacie Leier, reported Liz and Taylor have been going out to do inspections. Sheriff Randy McClafin would like to thank Cindy for all her years at Barnes County, reports he may be losing a deputy at the end of December, they have had several jail transports. Recorder, Jody Pfaff, has been working on back scanning miscellaneous documents and are back to 1983, they will also have Passport Training coming up which will be online. Chief Correction Officer, Jeremy Wolff, reported US Marshall holds have increased from six to 12, taking up to eight overflows, has one new hire, DOCR inspection is this week, and he has no female applications. Weed Officer, Jamen Windish, is fixing and repairing equipment and working on end of year grants. Shane Kalbrener reported the Social Service workers have finished moving from the northwest office to the southeast office and remodeling will start right away, thank you to the Highway Department for helping finish the sidewalk edging. MIS Director, Jason Thiel, brought in his new employee, Jordyn Everson. Welcome Jordyn. Adobe Acrobat was going to licensing per person, so he was researching and found a new product called PDF Gear he is going to try which is free. Jessica is also reminding employees to get the numbers in for attending the Christmas Party.

Cindy Schwehr has City County Health District meeting next week. Horses are out quite a bit along River Road and questioned whether something could be done. Vicky Lovell reported on the canvassing process. She will be attending the annual Township Meeting on Thursday, there will be two interviews coming up. Bill Carlbom announced the Economic Supper will be tonight and reiterated the Winter Show had a good year and will be doing the derby again.
