RESOLUTION No. 2015-5

WHEREAS, the control of access is authorized by the North Dakota Century Code as a valid police power of the Board of County Commissioners, and WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners deem that there is a need to control access on county roads in said County, and WHEREAS, control of access is defined as the condition where the right of owners or occupants of abutting land or other persons to access, light, air or view in connection with the highway is fully or partially controlled by public authority, and WHEREAS, partial control of access means that the authority to control access is exercised to give preference to through traffic to a degree that, in addition to access the connection with selected public roads, there may be some crossing at grade and some private driveway connections. (AASHO) NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT: 1) Ideally on any county road there shall be no more than five access points per mile per side including section line access points. However, additional approaches may be considered; 2) Any subdivision platted after the passing of this resolution will require a frontage road; 3) Ideally, approaches will be spaced 1,320 feet apart. However, a lesser distance will be considered when special circumstances dictate, i.e. terrain, ownership boundaries, speed limits and site distances. When possible, an approach on one side of the highway should align with the approach on the opposite side of the highway; and 4) When there is no access available as set out above, any division, subdivision or platted area shall require a frontage road.
