

July 16th, 2025 Shelby Larson, District Conservationist (DC)

Cody and I attended SE Zone meeting in Jamestown on June 25th

WRE/WRP onsite monitorings have been completed

CRP paperwork is really picking up on the NRCS side, last years CRPs are being planted and older ones are completing mid contract management. New signup work has also started

Barnes County Food and Agricultural Council (FAC) met on June 24th at the office conference room. We mainly discussed disaster options and how producers can move forward. Lots of structural damage. Quite a few soybean fields getting replanted

I attended a soil salinity training in Barnes County on June 30th

Waterbank signup closed on July 11^{th} . Cody and I completed and submitted 8 high ranking offers along with 11 other offers

EQIP signup deadline is September 19th

NRCS is offering lateral moves within the agency for critical vacancies, opening up today



July 2025 District Technician Report

Trees:

- ➤ The 2025 tree planting/weed barrier installation was finished at the end of June. A total of 19 sites were planted with 74,280ft of trees and weed barrier installed.
- Surplus sale was completed and cooler cleaned/sanitized.
- ➤ I finalized all tree plans and OHF pay applications for 2025 plantings. Pay apps were completed and submitted on July 14th. We will be receiving a \$60,575.63 (75%) reimbursement later this year.
- ➤ 2026 OHF funding has been approved. Waiting for word of application batching. I have 35 interested producers so far.
- Will be scheduling people this week to get their plans developed and applications completed

❖ Drills:

- ➤ John Deere 1590 10ft drill has delivered to 13 sites this spring totaling 536 acres.
- > Custom seeded 8 of the 19 tree planting sites with Landpride seeder.

❖ Park:

- ➤ Park was hit by a potential tornado on June 20^{th.} I have spent many days there cleaning up trees, stumps and debris. Cody and Shelby helped me with the large tree removals. Signs and fencing needed to be repaired. Seeded new grass in areas where large areas of trees were destroyed.
- New concrete was poured for signage and a bike rack for the river trail. The entrance of the park was left with a lot of cleanup and damaged grass. Also had damage in the ditch earlier this spring from a car rollover. The park has had a tough spring.
- > Continue to mow, spray and perform regular maintenance also.

Other:

➤ Had a load of rock and load of gravel delivered and filled in unused culvert that was in the middle of our shed yard.
